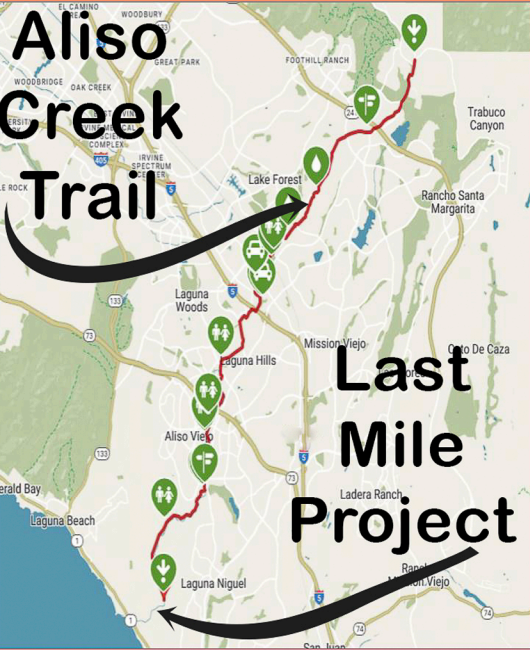

Aliso Creek Bike Trail Last Mile Project History

In 2013, the Laguna Beach Golf and Bungalow Village, LLC, purchased the property now known as The Ranch at Laguna Beach. The new owner submitted a proposal to redevelop the property from a golf course and apartment complex into a destination resort. In order to ensure that the public would have access to the coast, the California Coastal Commission required in 2015 that the owner place \$250,000 in an account with the City of Laguna Beach to be used to develop a paved bike and pedestrian trail through the property to Aliso Beach.

Eight years have passed since the \$250,000 was placed with the City of Laguna Beach and no material action took place until March of 2023. At a recent Laguna Beach City Council meeting, it was voted to release \$30,000 to conduct trail placement studies through the Laguna Canyon Foundation.

These studies will be completed by June and there will be a City Council hearing some time in July or August to review the findings and determine next steps for the project.



The Clock Is Ticking

Unfortunately, the clock is ticking on the ten-year project completion requirement set by the California Coastal Commission in 2015. Only two years remain to complete this project, and many steps need to take place including multiple governmental approvals.

We need your help to send a loud and clear message to the City of Laguna Beach and the California Coastal Commission that completion of this trail needs to take place within this timeline.
